

LETTER FROM OUR NEW MINISTER, REV DOUGLAS MONAGHAN

Dear Friends

Firstly, let me thank you all for welcoming me into your congregation with such warmth and friendship, it has been great meeting so many of you and I look forward to getting to know you all more over the coming months.

For those who don't know me yet, I was born in Paisley (which makes me a lifelong fan of St. Mirren) and grew up in Dumfries. For a while, I was interested in studying Divinity at University, but I was worried it wouldn't lead to a suitable job (a fear I still have) so went to study Law at Dundee University. While at University, I met my wife Eunice, who was also studying law. After graduating with my law degree and Diploma in Legal Practice, I did my legal traineeship in Dumfries practicing criminal defence law. During this time, I married, then began work as a criminal defence solicitor in Stranraer where I worked for seven years. Our four children, David, Ross, and twins Euan and Megan were born during this time.

In 2001 I joined the Procurator Fiscal Service as a Procurator Fiscal Depute based in Aberdeen. After three years there, I was moved to cover the Banff office and was mainly based there with occasional excursions to Peterhead and Elgin. I had the sense that I was meant to be doing something else with my life but was not sure what. I began to think about what I could do. Ordained ministry was not an option I had in mind. To me, ministers were a very strange breed and I couldn't see myself as one at all. Yet God continued to pester me towards this vocation. After a few years of resisting, (I made Moses look enthusiastic about following the call), I began to think about ordained ministry and the few close confidants I mentioned this to did not laugh out loud. This was confirmation enough to begin investigations with the Church of Scotland.

I had intended to go to a church enquirers conference, but the Australian government intervened at this time by offering a three-year visa to go to Australia. We decided to take it up to have a bit of an adventure. After being assured the Church of Scotland would recognise the Uniting Church in Australia as a sister church, we set off for a new life in Adelaide and I began to investigate my call to ministry. After three years I was not yet ordained and had not completed my Bachelor of Ministry Degree. The Church of Scotland advised that I would need to be ordained and have my degree before I could consider coming back. We extended our visa and then became citizens to allow this to happen. I was also told it would be beneficial to have some experience as a minister behind me before returning and so I began ministry there. As my children were entering the final years of High School, we decided to remain in Australia for them to finish their education and then, of course, Covid hit. My three years in Australia lasted for thirteen!

I was very fortunate that the Church of Scotland allowed me to interview for a Familiarisation ministry placement over the internet and was delighted to be accepted. I was extremely fortunate to be placed at Letham St. Marks Church in Perth under the supervision of Rev Jim Stewart for my familiarisation period. After I was accepted as a fit and proper person to be a minister in the Church of Scotland, I hit the snag of no church being able to call a minister due to the restructuring of the parishes and Presbyteries. I was able to get an assistant minister position at the Steeple church in Dundee until I received the call to come to Monifieth South Angus.

I'm looking forward to getting to know the congregation here and there are plenty of exciting projects in the works not least the renovation of Murroes church hall. I am happy to meet up for a cuppa and

a chat. I do have two absolutes though, I am never "too busy" and there is no such thing as "bothering the minister". I believe I am called by a congregation to minister to a community. Feel free to contact me, my vestry door is open, my email is monitored, and my phone is usually charged.

ORDINATION OF REV TIM PODGER AS AN OLM

Our warmest congratulations go to Tim Podger who was recently ordained as an OLM (Ordained Local Minister) and is now Rev Tim Podger. His ordination took place in August in the newly created Strathmore Parish Church where he is to continue his ministry

A service held on the 8th of August not only marked the creation of Strathmore Parish Church following the union of Ardler, Kettins and Meigle, Eassie, and Newtyle and Glamis churches, but also celebrated the ordination and introduction of Rev Tim Podger as an Ordained Local Minister (OLM).

Tim will be attached to the new charge and is the first of three new OLMs who will be ordained into the Presbytery of Perth over the next few months.

In becoming an OLM, Tim is fulfilling the prediction of a former school chaplain that he would become a member of the clergy, although that teacher had priesthood in the Church of England in mind at the time. Tim did consider training to become a non-stipendiary minister, the Anglican Church's equivalent of OLM, but about to be married and start a new job, the timing was not right.

Instead, he continued on a career in the chemical and oil and gas industry which took him around the world with postings in Germany, Italy, Belgium, the USA and shorter stays in Singapore and elsewhere, as well as the UK.

However, when he and his wife Lynn moved to Scotland in 2006, they made a commitment to putting down roots and not to move further until their two sons had completed school.

That led to their becoming involved with the Church of Scotland, with Tim becoming treasurer and then later an elder at his local church.

A sense of call

Then, when after he was made redundant from his job and opted to take early retirement, a passage from Luke about service he read at Bible study started him thinking about ministry once again, especially as it was quickly followed by an email from the Church of Scotland asking for anyone interested to attend one of its online discernment webinars while in-person events were placed on hold as a result of Covid.



"I felt a sense of call from that passage and three days later I was given something to do about it," Tim said.

Although just missing out on the age deadline to be a minister of Word and Sacrament, he began studying to be an OLM, which is an unpaid and part-time ministry role.



He graduated from the University of the Highlands and Islands' Highland Theological College last summer, before going to his probationary period at Newtyle.

Although his parents, brother and younger son were unable to attend the service, Tim and Lynn were joined by their eldest son, daughter-in-law and granddaughter as well as members of his home congregation and the churches where he carried out his probation and other placements, and other

friends and colleagues, including members of the Perth Presbytery OLM network.

Rev Tim is now looking forward to continuing his work in the new joint parish.
